



LESSON PLAN

Global Gab

Topic: **Global Gab** | Grade Level: **Elementary (3rd–4th Grades)**
Subject: **World Cultures/Foreign Language** | Time: **50 minutes**

OBJECTIVE(S):

Students will learn about South Korea, a country where many service members are stationed, through an exploration of the country's culture, including some common Korean words.

MATERIALS NEEDED:

- Introduction to *Where Are You Going?* Video for South Korea and Language section
- *Global Gab Game: South Korea*
- Index cards and markers (for making flash cards)
- "Korean Language Words" Worksheet
- Map or Globe

LESSON

Suggested Activity Set-up and Discussion

- Teacher sets up lesson (*15 minutes*)
 - Explain that sometimes people in the military have to move to another country for work. To prepare for the move, they have to learn about the country. Sometimes they have to learn a new language to help them communicate. Military kids often learn about the country where their parent is working.
 - Tell the class that they will view some videos about South Korea and learn some words from the Korean language together.
 - Ask students where South Korea is located. Show students South Korea on the map or globe. Ask students to share anything they know about South Korea. Compared to the United States, what might be the same or different in South Korea? Probe for "language" and ask if they know what language is spoken in South Korea.

Video (*2 minutes*)

- Cue Video Introduction to *Where Are You Going?: South Korea* and *South Korea: Language* videos.

Teacher-Led Discussion (*8 minutes*)

- Tell students to listen for any Korean words as they watch the video (note the words—spelling doesn't count). After the videos, discuss what students learned about Korean culture and language.

Worksheet Activity (*25 minutes*)

- Distribute the "Korean Language Words" worksheet. Ask students to create two sets of flash cards using the index cards and markers (see directions on worksheet) and practice with a partner.

Tips

- Encourage students to play the *Global Gab* game on the MilitaryKidsConnect.org website during their free time. They can practice Korean words or choose to learn the other languages.
